CASE MANAGEMENT ORDER

Pursuant to Rule 529.a, the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado ("Commission"), on its own motion, will consider additions and amendments to Commission Rules of Practice and Procedure, 2 C.C.R. 404-1 ("Rules"), 100-Series, 200-Series, 300-Series, 400-Series, 500-Series, 700-Series, 800-Series, and 900-Series as part of its "Financial Assurance" rulemaking.

Filina Requirements

- 1. **Filing and Service**. In deadlines set below, the term "file" means that all pleadings, unless otherwise noted, have been filed in the COGCC eFiling system by 7 p.m. Mountain Time on the pertinent deadline.
- 2. To file with the COCC's eFiling system, a party must register with the COGCC's eFiling system online at https://oitco.hylandcloud.com/DNRCOGExternalAccess/Account/Login.aspx, and select "Request Access to Site." Prehearing Statements

Prehearing Statements Shall Contain the Following:

- 1. A statement of the party's positions;
- 2. Exhibit list and attached (electronic) exhibits, if applicable;
 - Parties may file a redline of the Rules as an exhibit, and when necessary and helpful, comment bubbles that explain the rationale for the proposed revision.
 - Exhibits will be labeled numerically with the relevant party's name. The parties
 will endeavor to minimize the number of duplicative exhibits. Each exhibit will
 be labeled separately and filed electronically as a separate .pdf file.

- 3. A statement of the open legal issues; and
- 4. A statement of the relief requested.

Prehearing statements are limited to 14 double-spaced pages with 12-point font, excluding any attached exhibits. Organizations or party groups, to the extent they contain multiple individual organizations, companies, or parties, are limited to one prehearing statement per organization per Rule Series.

Finally, each party may list no more than two anticipated witnesses, to be finalized in the parties' Responses to Prehearing Statements. Any witness included in the party's witness list must prepare pre-filed written testimony.

The Hearing Officer will determine the final time allocations for each party to present its case after consideration of, among other things, the prehearing statements, the number of parties wishing to participate in the rulemaking, and the pre-filed written testimony.

Responses to Prehearing Statements

Parties may file one Response to Prehearing Statements. Responses are limited to 8 double-spaced pages with 12-point font, excluding the certificate of service and any attached exhibits. Replies in support of a prehearing statement are not authorized. Parties that intend to submit pre-filed written testimony shall include with their response to prehearing statements a final witness list with a brief description of each witness' testimony and resumes of any expert witness.

Pre-filed Written Testimony

In addition to filing a prehearing statement and a responsive prehearing statement, parties must file pre-filed written testimony for any witness listed in their response to prehearing statements. Any exhibit that a party's pre-filed written testimony references or relies upon must be filed in conjunction with the pre-filed written testimony. Any such exhibits must be labeled numerically with the relevant party's name. The parties will endeavor to minimize the number of duplicative exhibits. Each exhibit will be labeled separately and filed electronically as a separate .pdf file. Rebuttal pre-filed written testimony is not permitted. At the hearing, all witnesses who prepared pre-filed written testimony must be available to answer any questions the Commissioners might have about such pre-filed written testimony.

Pre-filed written testimony is important because it encourages parties to fully develop and disclose their cases prior to the hearing. In addition, it allows the Commissioners to better prepare for the hearing by reviewing the parties' positions and formulating questions in advance. Consolidation

Parties are highly encouraged to file combined prehearing statements and file prefiled written testimony on behalf of multiple parties. The Commission recognizes that parties may share similar viewpoints and positions. Having several parties join together to deliver a combined, consistent position is impactful and aids the Commission throughout the hearing process. Recognizing that there may be a large number of parties to this Docket, the Commission and the hearing process will be most effective if parties combine their arguments and positions.

Rule 512 Statements

If you are not a formal party to this rulemaking, you will still be able to submit either a written statement or deliver an oral comment to the Commission regarding the proposed rules pursuant to Rule 512.

You may not submit a written statement and deliver an oral comment. If the Commission receives a written comment and a request to make an oral comment from the same person, the Commission will accept the written comment and not call on the person for oral comment.

Any Person wishing to submit a written comment for this matter must register with the COGCC's eFiling system online at

- 4. Finally, to the bottom right select "**Import**" to upload your Public Comment.

Written comments are due by Friday, September 10, 2021, at 7 p.m.

The Commission will make available the opportunity for persons to sign up to make oral comments during the hearing. Instructions for oral public comments will be provided and announced on the COGCC website. Sign up for oral comments will be due by **Thursday, September 16, 2021, at 7 p.m.**

Motions Prohibited

Any filings, motions, or requests not set forth in this CMO are prohibited unless the Hearing Officer grants leave for the party to submit the filing, motion, or request. Any filing, motion, or request not set forth in this Case Management Order that is filed will be included in the record. The Hearing Officer may elect to rule on the motion, or to defer to

the Commission, which may elect to address such filing, motion, or request at the hearing. **Continuances**

If this matter is continued beyond its original hearing date, as specified by this Case Management Order, the dates and deadlines of this Case Management Order still control. The dates and deadlines set by this Case Management Order shall remain in full force and effect until the Commission disposes of this matter.
